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
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

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




WARM Rotations and Clinical Locations

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Career Advising, Journals, Articles, and More



Career Advising within the Academic & Career Advising Program (ACAP) begins in M1 Fall with completion of the Careers in Medicine assessment. This is one of seven mandatory "touchpoints" all students have with Career Advising at SMPH. The comprehensive Career Advising Canvas Course is the definitive source for career advising information, and WARM students are encouraged to develop, and maintain, connections with their ACAP house mentor throughout the curriculum. In April of the M3 year, students complete a Match competitiveness survey and career advising session in Madison to guide the residency application/interview process.

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




